



The ISSC was notified by email on March 19, 2015, of the following recall:

Washington State is in the process of conducting a recall of oyster shellstock related to a potential Norovirus outbreak. All oyster shellstock harvested as part of the Skokomish Tribe dig at Lilliwaup State Park Hood Canal 5, harvested on 2/17 with a majority sold to Padden Seafood WA 1617-SS and D.D. Denotta WA 1373-SS is being recalled. Some of this product made its way to Oregon and California but they are still getting details. Additionally, all oyster shellstock harvested from Hood Canal 5, Hama Hama area south of the Hama Hama River or beach wet stored south of the Hama Hama River between 2/16-3/5 may also be involved in a separate norovirus outbreak. The identified company regarding the Hama Hama recall is; Hama Hama Company, WA 0259-SP. It is Washington State's understanding that Hama Hama Company has already contacted its customers involved in the following states:
