### PRECAUTIONARY PARTIAL CLOSURE (north latitude line 29°13'12") OF MOLLUSCAN SHELLFISH GROWING WATERS IN LOUISIANA

Pursuant to the provisions of LSA RS 40:5.3, as amended and re-enacted by Act 1 of the First Regular Legislative Session of 1988, and RS 40:5, molluscan shellfish growing areas located south of latitude line 29°13'12" from the Houma Navigation Canal red buoy line westward to the eastern shore of Oyster Bayou in Areas 17, 19, and 21 are hereby "PARTIALLY CLOSED" to the harvest of all molluscan shellfish.

This partial closure is being taken as a precautionary measure due to the oil spill in the Gulf of Mexico.

Reopening of these shellfish harvest areas will be conducted as soon as it is determined environmental conditions are within the requirements specified by the National Shellfish Sanitation Program.

This order effective at official sunset July 1, 2010.
