

The following information was provided to ISSC:

On Monday September 9, 2021, the Washington State Department of Health (WA DOH) initiated a recall of all species of shellstock harvested from the Hood Canal #1 growing area, North of the Hood Canal Bridge in Jefferson and Kitsap Counties, WA.

All species harvested from 9/6/2021 through 9/9/2021 are being recalled due to high levels of PSP detected in samples. The WA DOH action level for closure is 80 micrograms. The lab results indicated 285 micrograms.

WA DOH is working to gather quantities of product affected and disposition of that product from harvesters in the area. Oysters were shipped to California during this period.

WA DOH is waiting for distribution details from the shellfish company. Please let us know if you have any questions.
